

DISCOVER BALI

1 • Pulau Menjangan – This island is part of a protected under-water reserve.

2 • Singaraja – The original capital of Bali, a port where the first cruise ship landed.

3 • Pura Beji – Some of the most ornate stone carvings and friezes are found at this temple.

4 • Air Sanih – Cool off at this fresh-water spring-fed pool by the seaside.

5 • Toya Bungkah – Soak or swim in hot mineral springs at the foot of the volcano.

6 • Penulisan Temple – 1,745m above sea level, houses a collection of the oldest statues in Bali.

7 • Mount Batur – A two-hour climb to the peak of this extinct volcano offers a picturesque view.

8 • Lake Batur – Enjoy the lake's dramatic setting ringed by farming settlements and mountains.

9 • Bali Handara Kosaido Country Club – A championship course set in an extinct volcanic crater; a spectacular and challenging setting for a round of golf.

10 • Ayung River – White water rafting makes for an exhilarating way to view Bali's lush rainforest.

11 • Tulemben – Diving just offshore, with shipwreck, colourful fish and coral.

12 • Pura Besakih – Bali's mother temple sits on Mount Agung, Bali's most venerated mountain.

13 • Menanga – Salak palm orchards here are famous for this sweet snake-skin fruit.

14 • Tirta Gangga – Cool off in the spring-fed bathing pools of the royal family.

15 • Ujung Water Palace – Once a beautiful water palace built by Karangasem's last raja.

16 • Tenganan Village – Home to rare double ikat weaving called *geringsing* and a centre of Bali Aga traditions based on pre-Hindu beliefs.

33 • Nusa Penida – About 20km off-shore from Bali, day cruises from Amanusa and Amankila may be arranged. Known for the rare Mola Mola (sunfish).

32 • Nusa Lembongan – About 20km off-shore from Bali, day cruises from Amanusa and Amankila may be arranged.

31 • Pura Uluwatu – 8th century temple, one of Bali's *sad kahyangan* – the six temples of the heavens.

30 • Bali Golf & Country Club – One of Asia's top five golf courses, adjacent to Amanusa.

29 • Tanjung Benoa – Watch traditional boat building in the village.

28 • Pura Sakenan – On 'Turtle Island', this temple has an ancient 'prasada' monument.

27 • Kuta / Legian – Popular area for shopping, restaurants and entertainment.

26 • Nirwana Golf Club – One of Bali's three championship golf courses.

25 • Pura Tanah Lot – An ancient rock temple set in the sea dating to the 16th century.



24 • Batubulan – Watch the villagers carving statues and friezes from 'paras' sandstone.

23 • Mas – A village famous for its wood-carvers.

22 • Pengosekan – A Community of painters famed for the beauty of their work.

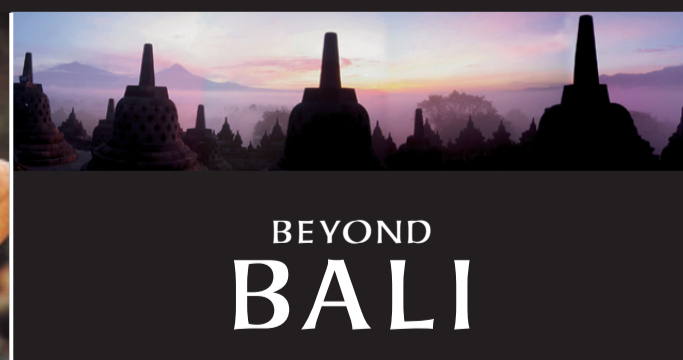
21 • Kusamba Fishing Village – Motorised outriggers ferry locals to and from Nusa Penida.

20 • Kertagosa – Ancient court-house with ceiling paintings.

19 • Goa Lawah – The Bat Cave is said to lead to Besakih Temple via an underground path.

18 • Padang Bai – This port connects Bali with eastern Indonesia. Ferries depart regularly to Lombok.

17 • Sideman Village – Unique high school teaching all aspects of Bali's culture. Beautiful views of Mt. Agung.



BEYOND BALI

EAST OF BALI, set on the nature reserve of Moyo Island, 15 kilometres north-west of Sumbawa, Amanwana ('peaceful forest') is a nature camp of 20 hardwood floor luxury tents set in a tropical forest overlooking the crystal clear waters of the Flores Sea. Offering some of the most pristine snorkelling and scuba diving sites in Indonesia, the Flores Sea is home to many varieties of coral and marine life. A professional dive centre provides for the needs of divers of all levels and a fleet of vessels offers everything from sports fishing to sunset cruises and picnic drop-offs on private beaches. A haven for hikers and nature lovers, many treks start right from the camp, with a highlight being the trek to the jungle waterfalls and their cool limestone pools.

WEST OF BALI lies Java, the land of legends. Many of the arts of Indonesia were generated in and bloomed from Central Java. Here the dance and music schools blossomed; great palaces and religious monuments from Hindu, Buddhist and Islamic faiths were built. Overlooking the 8th century Borobudur, the world's largest Buddhist sanctuary, Amanjiwo ('peaceful soul') is a 36-suite resort positioned within a natural amphitheatre. The Menoreh Hills rise behind and four volcanoes grace the horizon. Accessible from Central Java's international gateways of Yogyakarta and Solo, Amanjiwo provides the opportunity to explore the cultural heartland and artistic heritage of Central Java.
